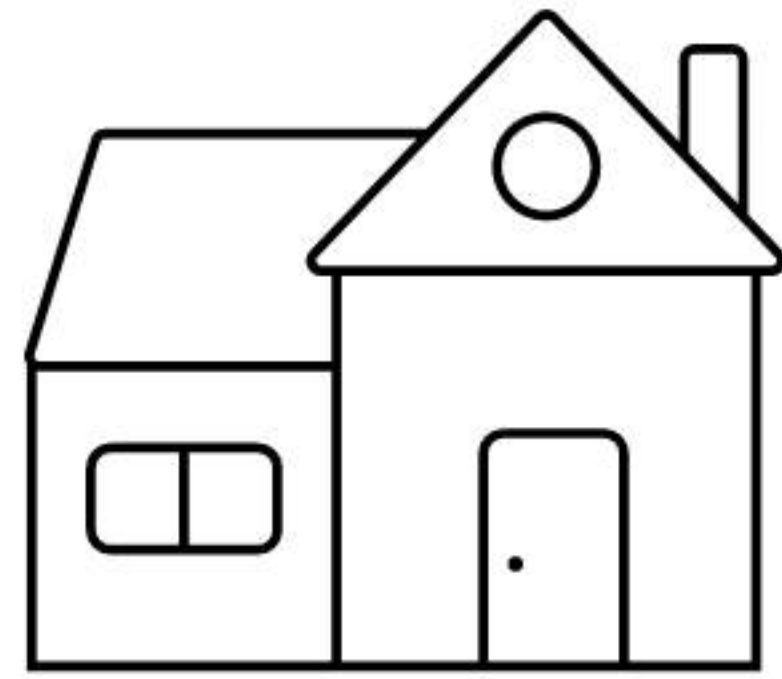

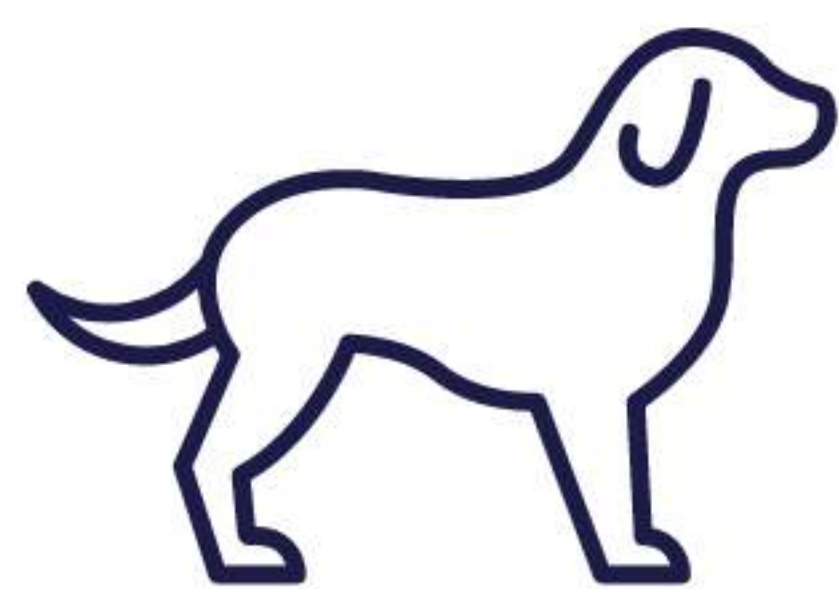

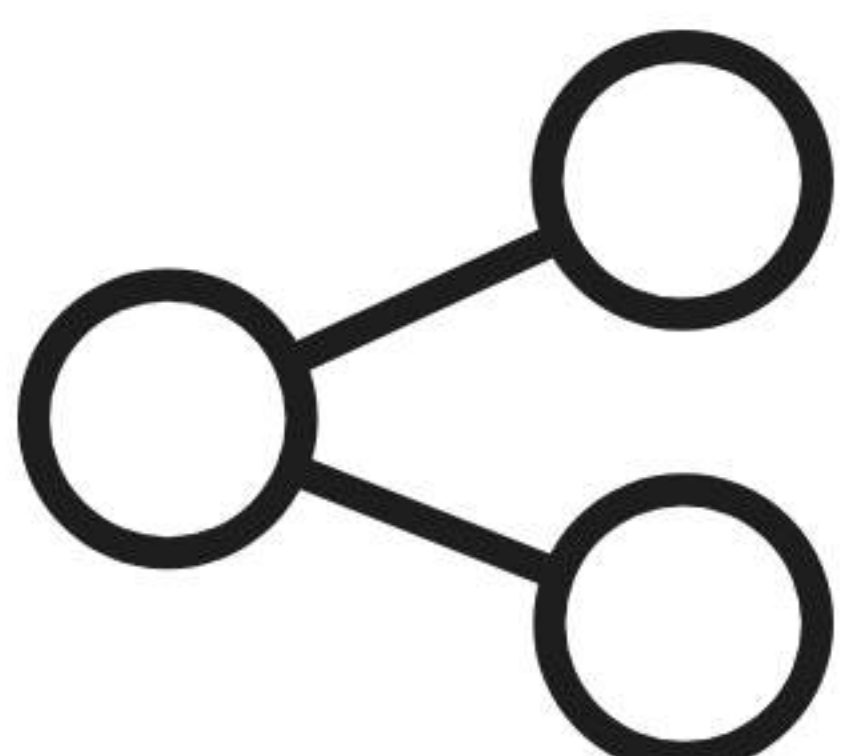

HORACE

Sometimes an owner will abandon or surrender their dog to a shelter because they don't want to treat an aging or terminally ill dog. Essentially, they are walking away when their dog needs them the most. These dogs might otherwise be overlooked because of their age or illness and they don't deserve to live out their remaining days in a cold and lonely shelter. Horace is one such dog.

When we met Horace, we knew immediately that he wasn't well; however, we initially thought he had an infection and we were hoping a round of antibiotics would help. After some additional testing, we learned he had terminal cancer. He has a tumor in his nose which created a lump at the bridge and is almost impossible to remove. His foster family was disheartened but didn't hesitate at keeping him as a hospice foster.



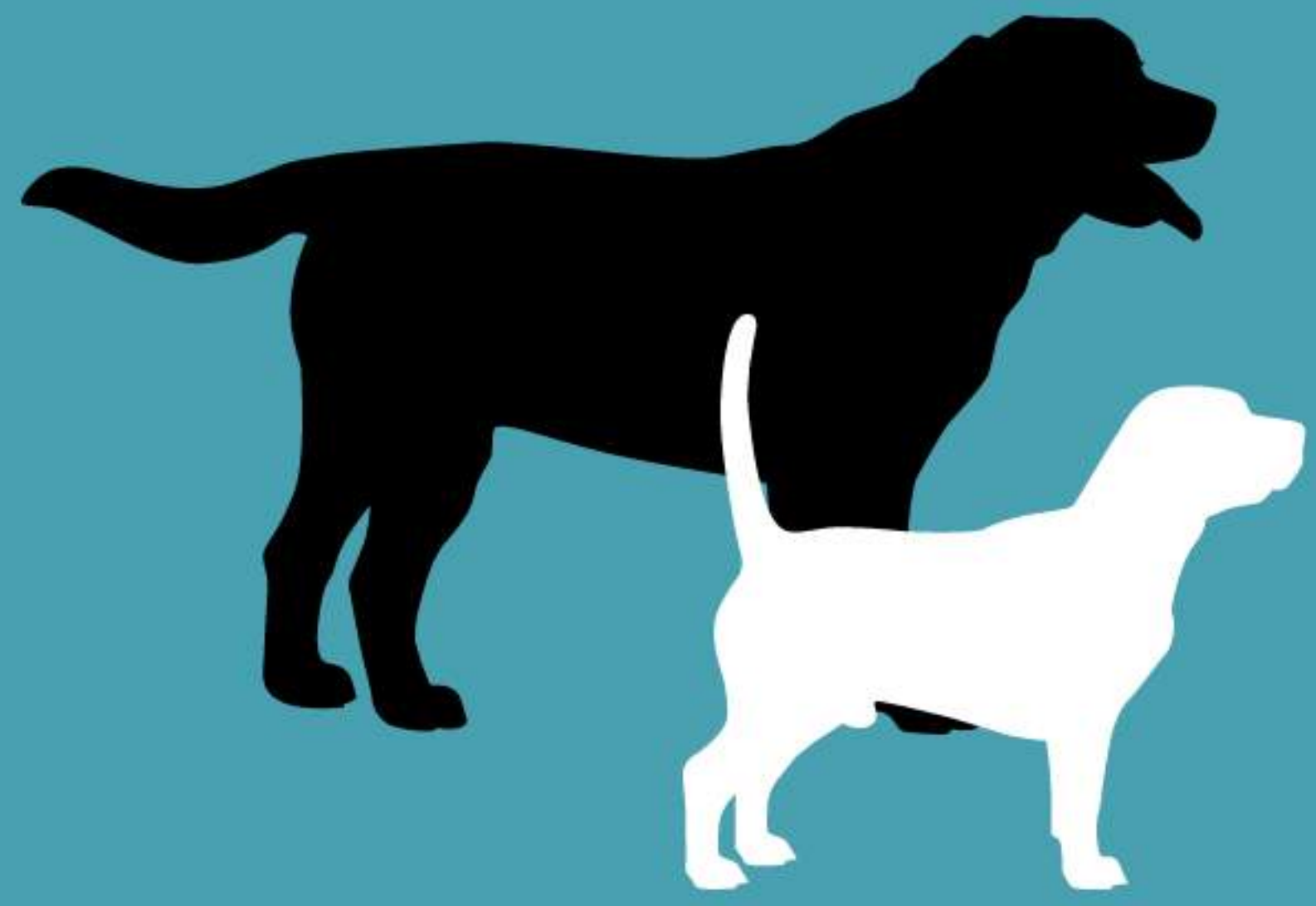
Taking in a dog knowing it will never recover takes a huge heart, but we're lucky to have volunteers who understand the needs of a dog in its most urgent situation. While we don't know how much time he has left, Horace would happily live out his days knowing love, dignity, and a soft bed in his foster home.

However, almost a year after Horace arrived, he was doing better than ever. Horace had more energy, more pep and even the vet techs agreed that the lump on his nose even looked smaller!

Knowing Horace was thriving after a year that no one thought he would have, the decision was made to put Horace up for adoption, so he could find his forever home to live out the rest of his days in a permanent home that he so deserves. Shortly after becoming available for adoption, he was scooped up into a wonderful, loving forever home where he is continuing to thrive. This year, we're thankful for Horace... for second chances... and for love healing everything.

Extra TLC

There's a little extra TLC in TLC these days.

Every dog deserves a forever home- some just need a little extra time, love and compassion on the road there. These dogs are our Extra TLC Dogs.

What makes them extra special can be a variety of needs: Heartworm Status, Visual or Hearing Impairment, Physical Ability, or Behavioral Characteristics. Each need making them even more lovable!

The Extra TLC dogs will still have their treatments and medical needs covered through TLC.

One of the most prominent needs faced is heartworm preventative and care. In 2021, TLC covered nearly **\$11,860** in Heartworm treatment for adoptable dogs. This is an average of **\$400-500** per dog with **29 rescued dogs** being treated by TLC this year.

Treatment varies by pet, but our rescue team and fosters make this process as comfortable as possible for the dogs- and as easy and transparent as possible for adopters.

In addition to heartworm, some of our rescues have also experienced skin issues, vision impairment, leg surgery, and more!



The Cost of Rescue

We've been asked a lot this past year why our adoption fees are "so high." Many people believe rescue is just about picking up stray or unwanted dogs from the streets, people's homes or shelters. While we whole heartedly believe in the fairytale of saving dogs and bringing them to a better life, it comes at a cost.

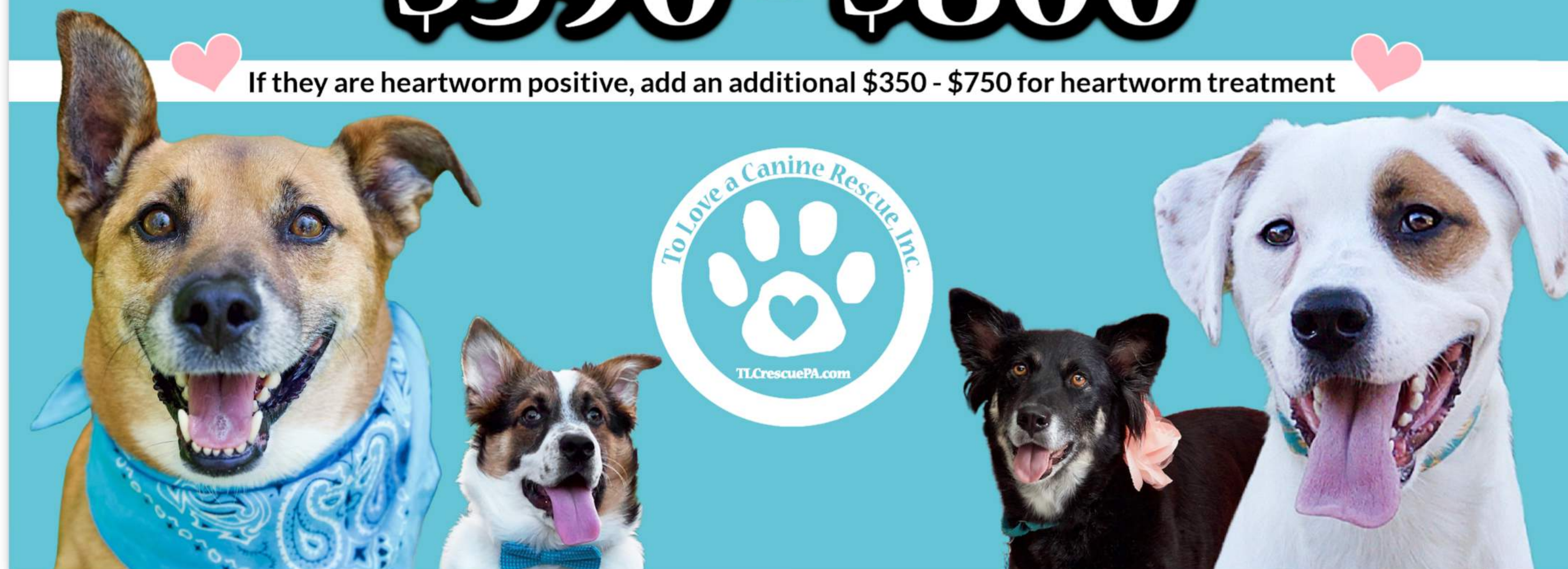

We are caring for neglected dogs who often times have not had proper medical care, necessary vaccinations or spay/neuter surgeries to prevent future litters. We are caring for living breathing animals who require transport from the shelters in Mississippi, Tennessee and South Carolina to Pennsylvania. We are welcoming these dogs into our care for a few days, weeks or even months while tending to their physical, emotional or behavioral needs with things like food, doggy daycare or training. While all of this sounds wonderful, it doesn't come free. Even as a non-profit rescue, we still have to pay (often times with a discounted fee) for all of the necessities to properly care for any dog who comes through our rescue.

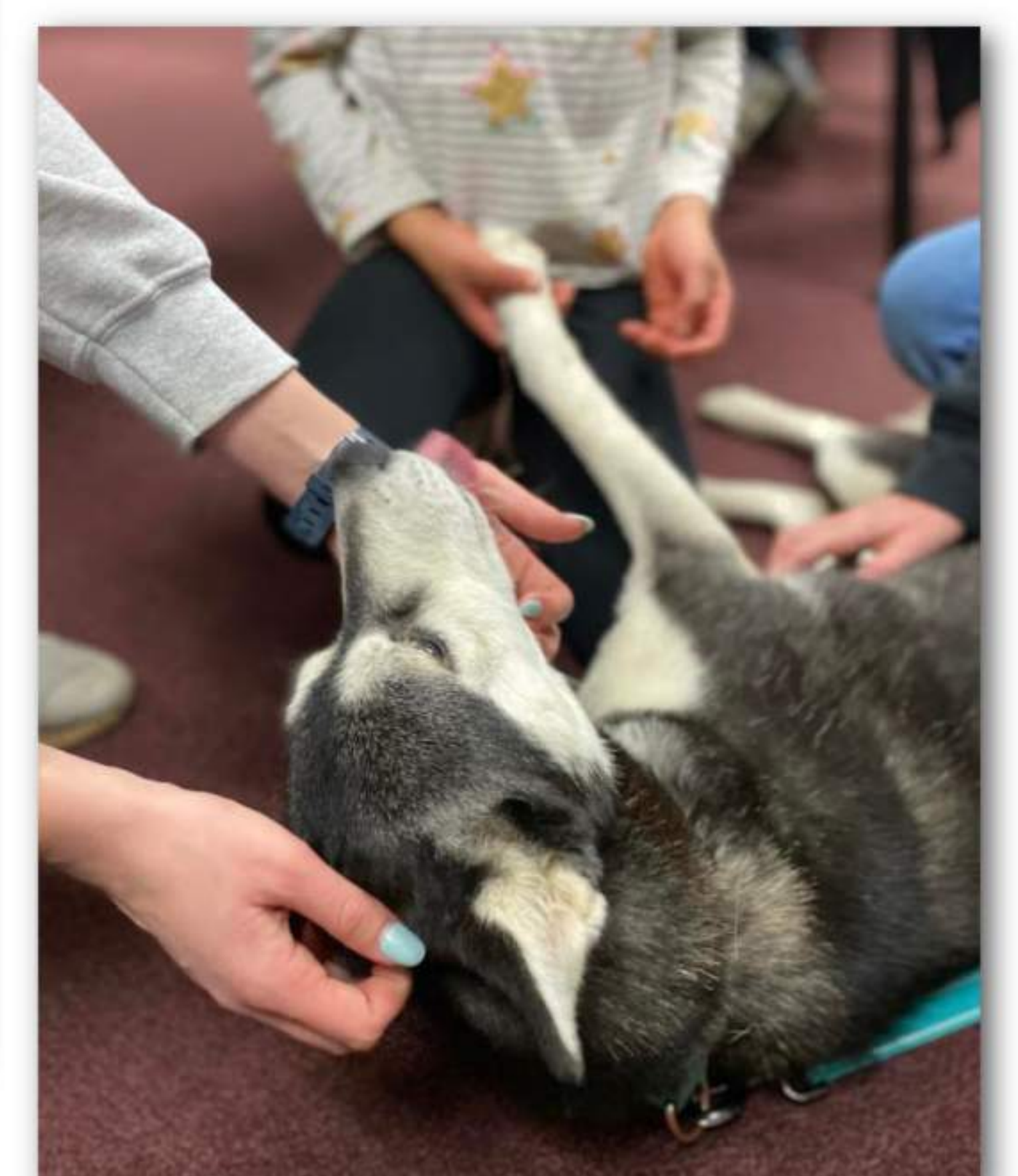
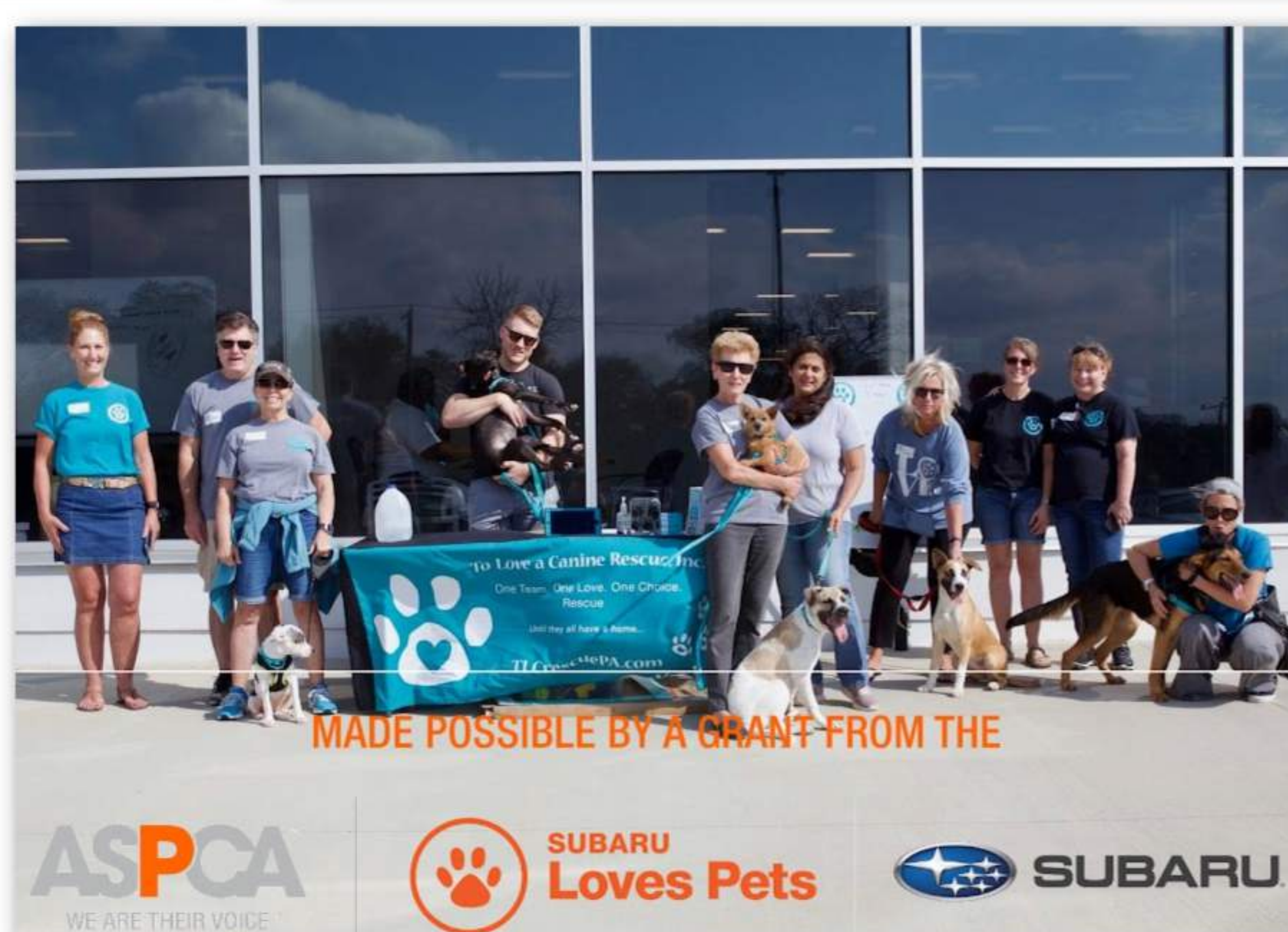
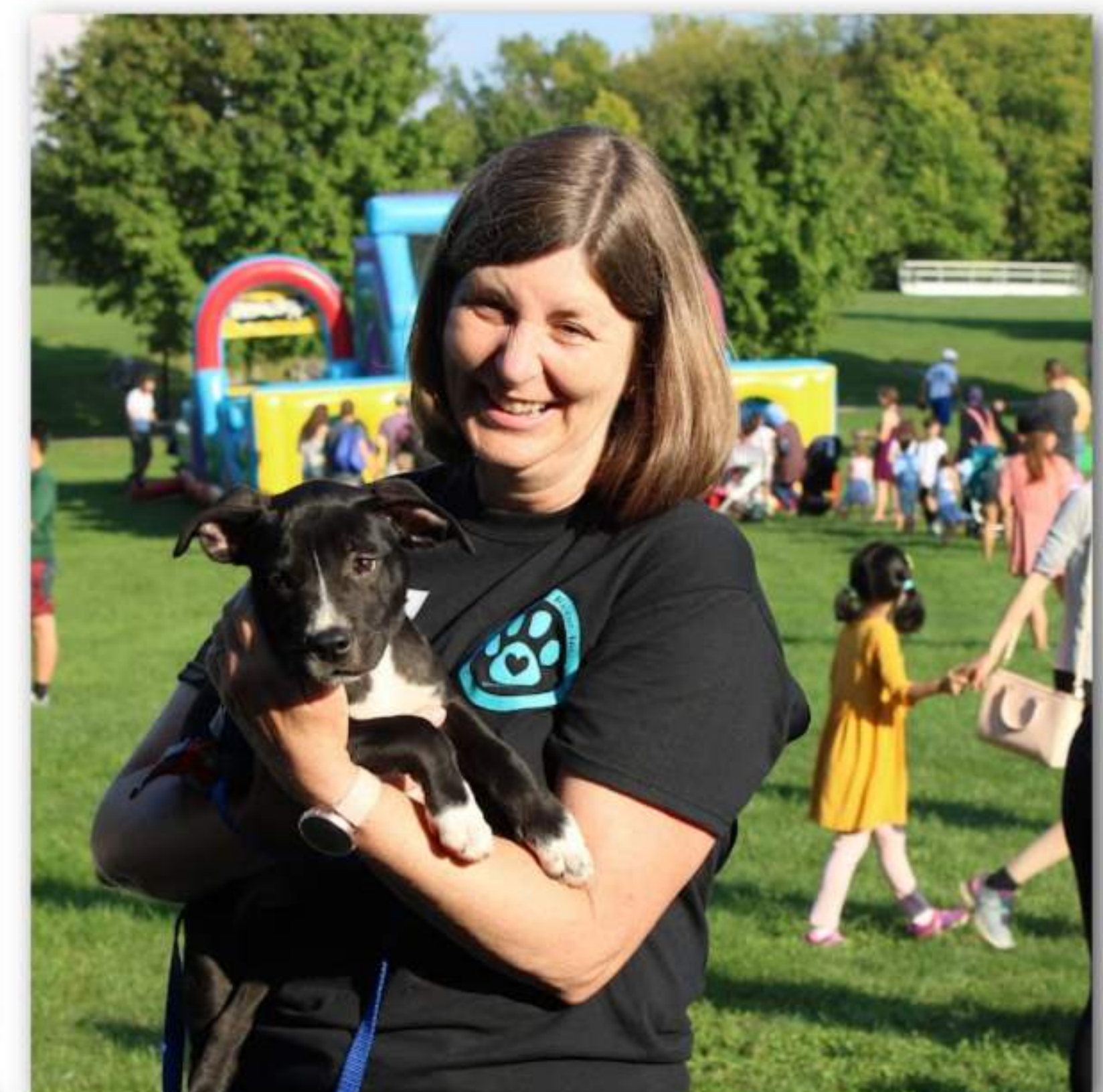
TLC Rescue participates in multiple community events each year and is committed to partnering with local schools, retail businesses and corporations, and participating in community festivals.

In addition to being fun for everyone involved, these engagements are a great way for adoptable dogs in foster care to receive as much visibility as possible. Let's be honest, it's much easier to fall in love with a dog in person when you can experience their personality firsthand than on a computer screen. Events hosted in the community are also a great way to socialize the dogs and continue to teach them appropriate behaviors and how to interact in social settings.

Whether it is dogs in need or people, this team comes through. We couldn't be more proud of our TLC team, who jumped at the opportunity to help community members who might be struggling this holiday season.



This year, TLC collected donations for Chester County Department of Children, Youth & Families who are being cared for by relatives to avoid placement in foster care. TLC made Christmas magical this year for 6 families and a total of 13 children. Every gift on each one of these kids's Christmas lists was fulfilled by generous donations from TLC. Over 70+ presents, 2 car loads, 13 kids, & 6 different homes. TLC kept the magic of Christmas alive this year for 13 very deserving children, 6 very thankful caregivers, and 1 extremely grateful caseworker.



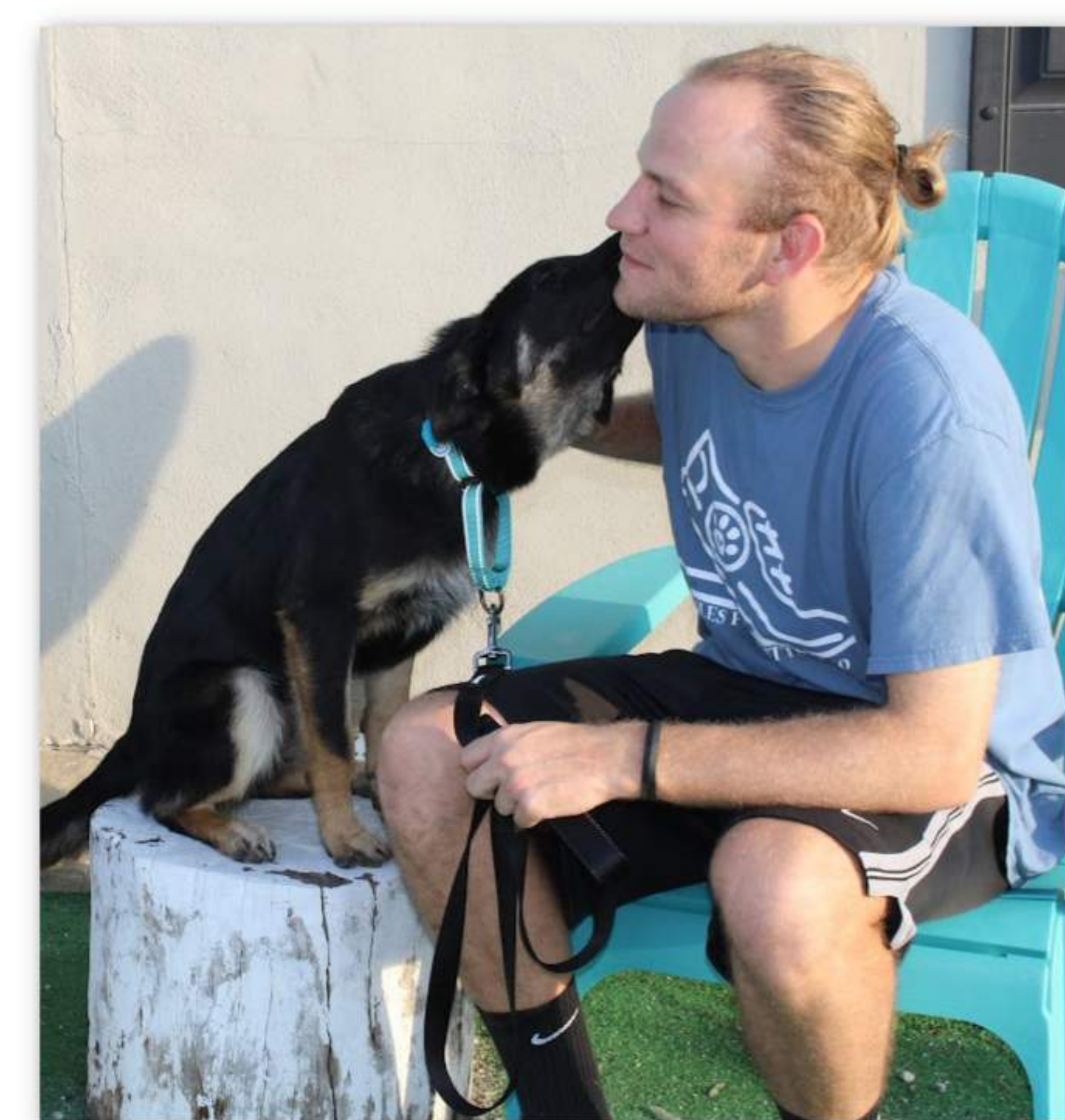
FREEDOM rides

When dogs, regardless of breed, age, size or personality, end up in over-crowded, high kill shelters, their greatest hope of finding their furever family is to be transported to partnering rescues.

Transports, aka "Freedom Rides", are when the rescues that TLC partners with meets TLC either at a mutually agreed upon location or at the TLC facility to transition their dogs into TLC Rescue's care.

The transport vehicle is greeted with many volunteers who are anxiously awaiting the opportunity to snuggle the welcomed new rescue pups. Upon arrival, each rescue dog is evaluated, weighed, microchipped, vaccinated if needed, and has their spay/neuter status confirmed. The dogs are then greeted by their fosters where they will be cared for until they transition to their furever home. TLC makes a commitment to their partnering rescues that they will work tirelessly to ensure that each dog transported will be given the best care until a family that fits their needs is identified.

This is often the first time a rescue dog feels free and ready to be loved unconditionally.

Corinth-Alcorn – A Partner in Rescue

TLC works with several shelter partners to help find homes for the dogs they take in.

From time to time, a group of our volunteers will visit one of those partners to help them with anything that may need to be done. This ranges from dog intakes and assessments, maintenance on the buildings, and preparing for transports.

The most recent trip was to Corinth-Alcorn Animal Shelter in Mississippi, one of our longest partner-relationships. Our group spent three days there, helping in any way they could.



One of our volunteers, Erin Jenesky, had this to say about their most recent trip to Corinth:

“When you’re in the trenches, when you are dealing with what are looked upon as the dregs of society, you would be fooling yourself to think you’re not unchanged from experiences such as this. And you’d be doing yourself a disservice to ever forget what you’ve seen and felt. These animals have been discarded like trash. It’s difficult to imagine, but the shelter in many cases is the safest place some of these dogs have ever had.”



Corinth-Alcorn Animal Rescue (CAAR) is the only no-kill animal rescue/shelter in a six county area of North Mississippi and West Tennessee. This area has a serious pet overpopulation, with many animals in need. To say they are overwhelmed would be an understatement, so if we are able to help, TLC is happy to step in and do what we can.

A Partner in Rescue - Continued



While there, our group worked with the CAAR team to assess dogs and determine any requirements for their adoptions. This included testing the dogs for any behavioral issues and ensuring that they are fully vetted with all medications up to date.

Once assessed, many of the dogs will be transported to rescue partners like TLC. One of those transports was scheduled to leave while our team was visiting, so the TLC group was able to assist in that process as well. TLC is typically one of final steps in finding a dog its furever home, so to be part of the earlier stages was quite rewarding!

Corinth-Alcorn works hard to keep things running. Earlier this year they reached out for help as their building was very run down and no longer adequate for their life-saving needs.

In addition to helping transport the dogs up north so that we could help them get adopted, we also asked our TLC community to help us raise funds to repair their space.



Together we raised \$1,500 to support Corinth-Alcorn's roof repair. This bought CAAR some time to continue their life-saving mission in better conditions.



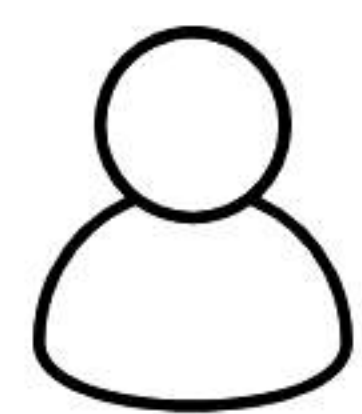
Now CAAR is in the process of moving to a new location. After being given a tour of the future shelter, our team was able to help with some of the preparations for that transition.

Dog rescue is a never-ending job, as there will always be animals that need homes. It can be one of the toughest responsibilities anyone can take on. By partnering with shelters like Corinth-Alcorn, we're able to share those responsibilities and lighten the burden just a little.

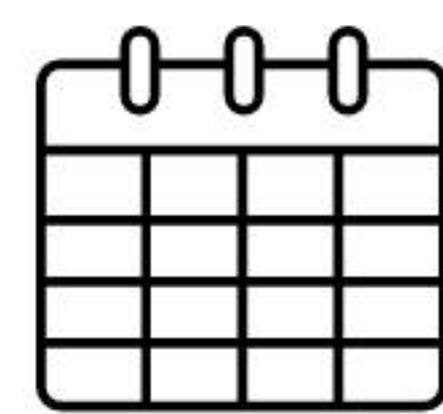

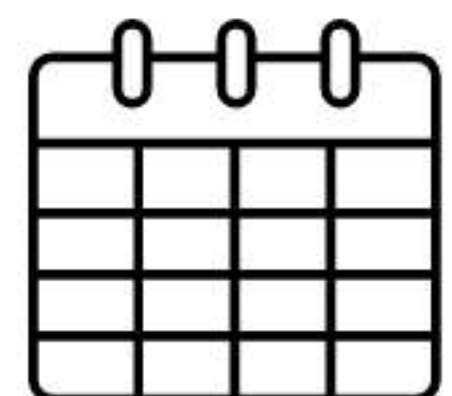

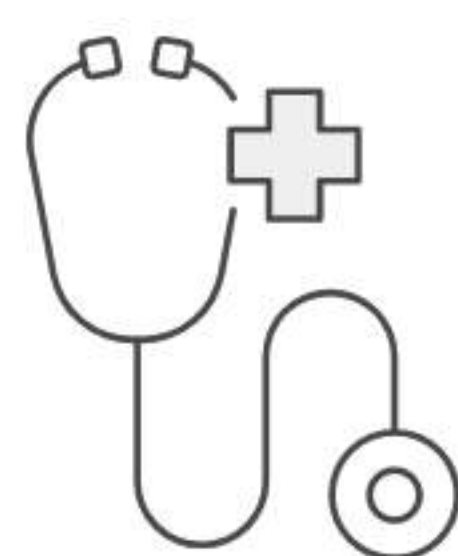
To kick off the year, our kids learned how to properly walk a dog in a public setting, as well as how to walk the puppies who had never been on leash before.



Our resident TLC dog trainer taught the Mini Paws about dog body language and keeping both people and dogs safe at all times.



The Mini Paws were trained in how to help at Meet & Greets, events, and transports!



We traveled to Metropolitan Vet (offsite offices) to learn how to perform CPR on our pups and cats. We practiced how to find a pulse and how to do chest compressions on a dog.



The Mini Paws traveled to Sunrise Senior Living in Exton. Kids and pups always bring a lot of sunshine to our seniors citizens, so this is a favorite activity each year!



The Mini Paws learned all about working dogs with presentations and demonstrations from K9 officers and Search and Rescue dogs.

There's no better time to begin your volunteer journey than **NOW!** With opportunities in-person and virtual, foster and non-foster, there is a volunteer option for everyone!



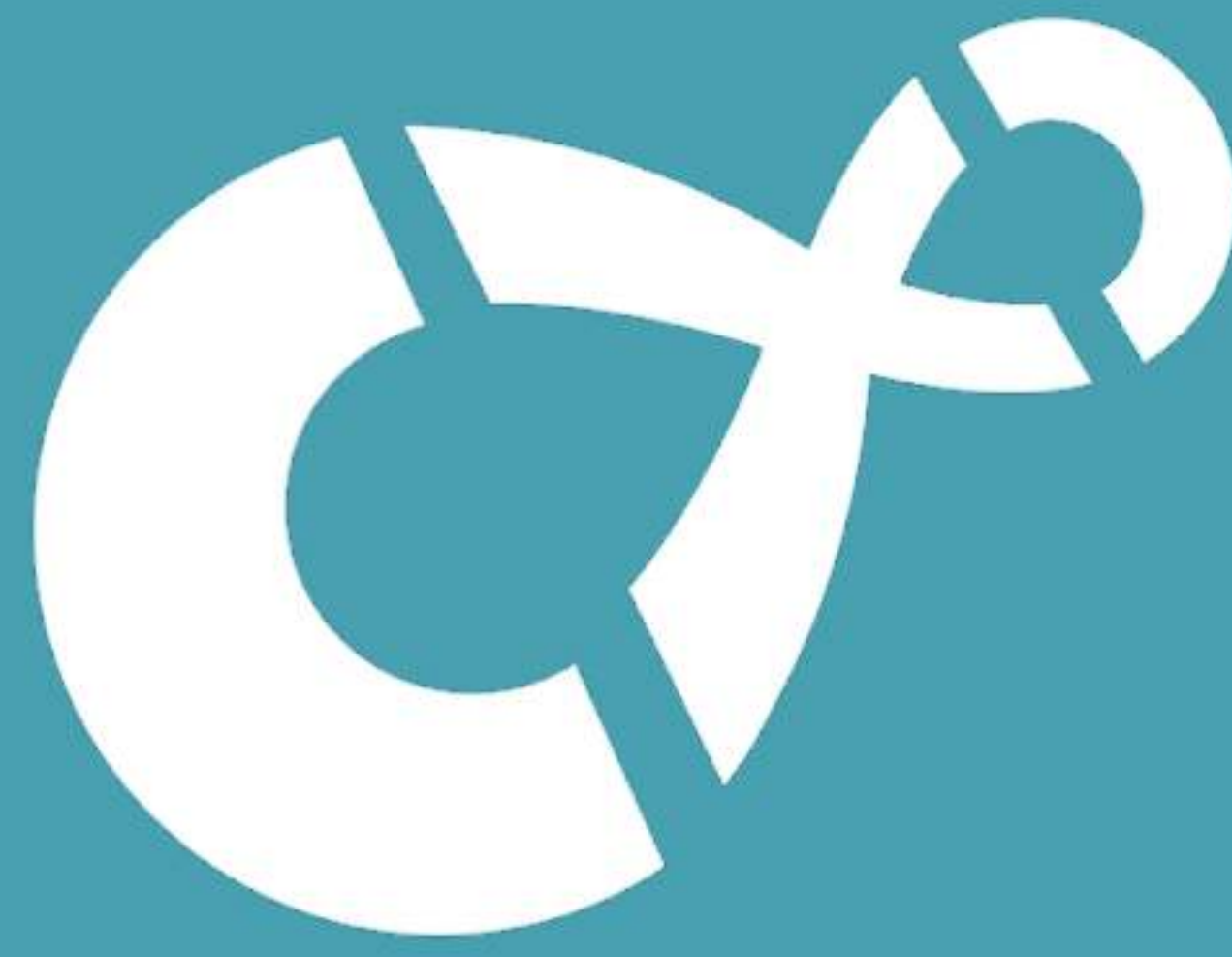

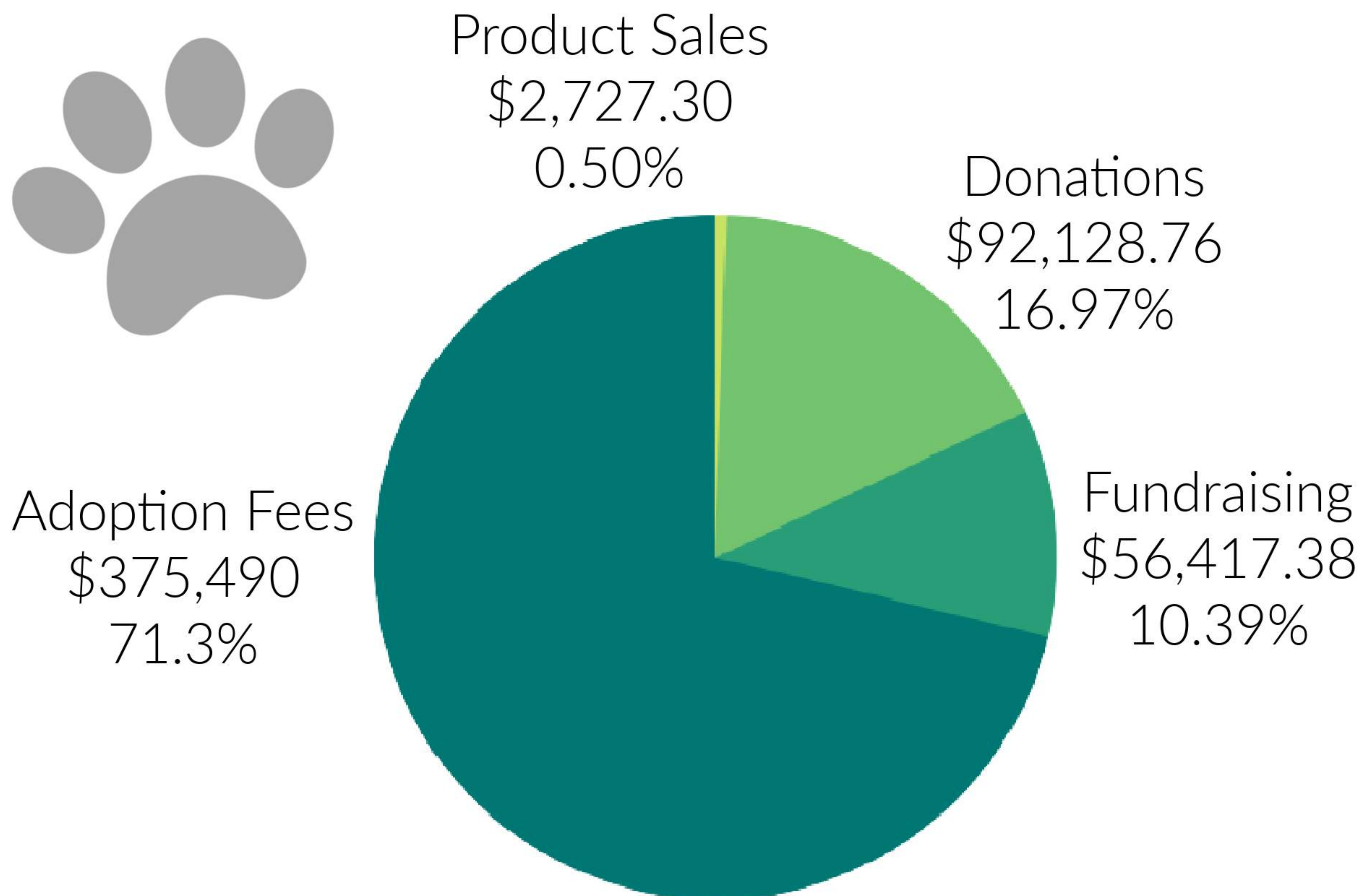

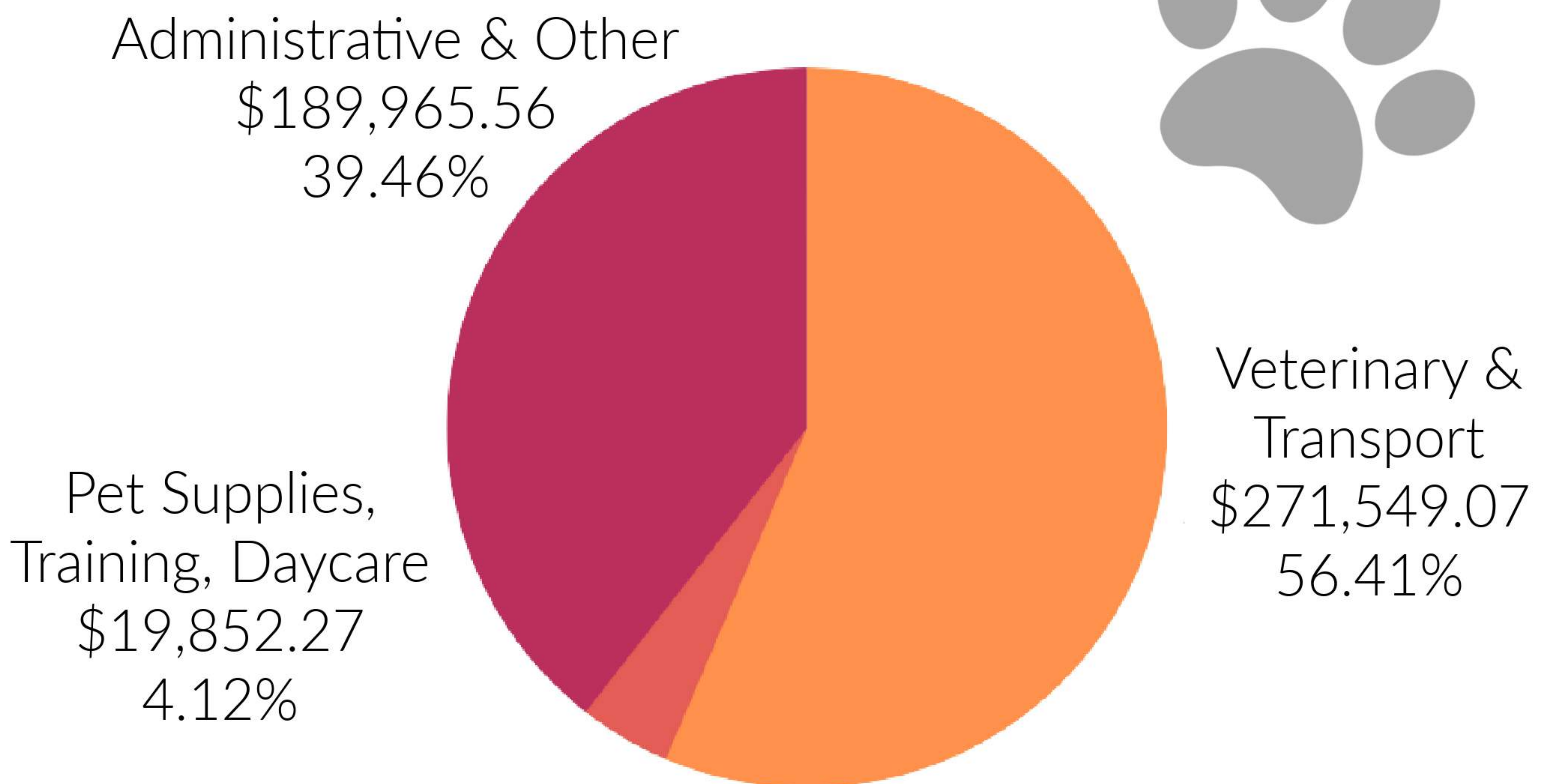
